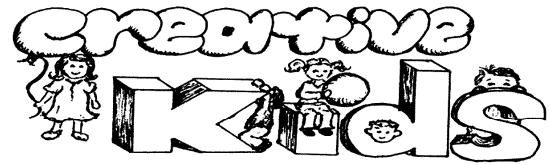

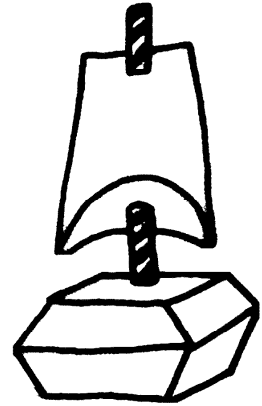


Recycled Boat!

You will need:

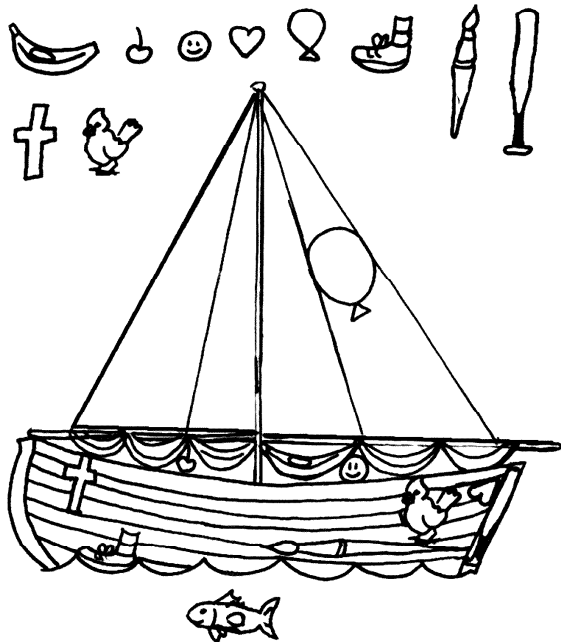
- Fast food container (from a burger/nuggets)
